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

The General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM)

- 1949 Constitutive Agreement under FAO Article XIV
- Competence over the Mediterranean and Black Sea
- 24 Members: 19 Med, 3 BS, Japan and UE. Cooperation with non-member riparian states and with other organizations through Memoranda of Understanding
- Power to adopt annually binding recommendations
- Since 2004 has a dedicated
 Secretariat and an autonomous
 budget paid by Members
- Agreement amended in 2014 to incorporate new elements such as focus on sub-regional aspects and multiannual management plans


Objectives:



Summary of directly management related GFCM recommendations

- The Commission started taking decisions on management plans in 2011-2012
 - ▶ GFCM Recommendation 35/2011/2 on the exploitation of red coral in the GFCM Competence Area and GFCM Recommendation 36/2012/1 on further measures for the exploitation of red coral
 - ▶ GFCM guidelines on Management plans (GFCM/36/2012), capacity control (GFCM/37/2013/2) and precautionary conservation measures.
 - Recommendation GFCM/37/2013/1 on a multiannual management plan for fisheries on small pelagic stocks
 - Recommendation GFCM37/2013/2 on the establishment of a set of minimum standards for bottom-set gillnet fisheries for turbot and conservation of cetaceans in the Black Sea
 - Recommendation GFCM/38/2014/I amending Recommendation GFCM/37/2013/I and on precautionary and emergency measures for 2015 on small pelagic stocks in the GFCM-GSA 17
 - Two proposals on the management of Strait of Sicily and Gulf of Gabès demersal fisheries, and one proposal on the management of Turbot

- Turbot fisheries in the Black Sea:
 - ▶ Sub Regional Group on Stock Assessment for the Black Sea (SGSABS)
 - Working Group on the Black Sea ad-hoc meeting on turbot fisheries
- Small pelagic fisheries in the Adriatic Sea
 - WG on Stock Assessment of Small Pelagics (WGSASP)

Advice from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to small pelagics in the Adriatic Sea

- Anchovy in GSA 17: in overfishing, with an exploitation rate E_c=0.50 higher than the reference point (E_{ref}=0.4), and with a low biomass (SSB=146,127.50; about 30th percentile of the time series)
- ▶ **Advice**: immediate reduction of fishing mortality
- Comments:
 - Full revision of input data and a benchmark assessment to be done in 2015;
 - ▶ A comprehensive evaluation of the effectiveness and consequences of the harvest control rules (HCRs) included in the existing management plan under Recommendation GFCM/36/2013/1 as well as potential alternatives should be carried out
- **Sardine in GSA 17:** in overfishing, with an exploitation rate of Ec=0.53 higher than the reference point (Eref=0.4).
- ▶ Advice: reduction of fishing mortality
- Comments: as for anchovy in GSA 17



Advice from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to demersal fisheries in the Strait of Sicily

- ► Hake in GSAs 12-16: in overfishing, with current fishing mortality F_c =0.55 higher than the reference point (F_{01} =0.14)
- Advice: reduce fishing mortality.
- Deep-water rose shrimp in GSAs 12-16: in overfishing, with current fishing mortality Fc=0.88 higher than the reference point (F01=0.70).
- ▶ **Advice:** reduce fishing mortality.



Advice from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to other stocks/fisheries

- Sardine in GSA 07: unbalanced, with almost no recruitment detected from the acoustic survey
- Advice: Fishing mortality should not be allowed to increase and monitoring of changes in the fishing effort/gears is required
- Hake and shrimps stocks in the Mediterranean were subject to high fishing mortality therefore calling for immediate action to reduce fishing mortality



General advice from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to management plans (I/II)

- For fisheries that generate bycatch of elasmobranchs, to incorporate the following management measures into future management plans:
 - Minimum and/or maximum landing sizes for those elasmobranchs species that can be commercialized;
 - Gear restrictions, including i) the prohibition of wire leaders, chemical light sticks and the obligation to use corrodible hooks in longline fisheries, and ii) the reduction of soak time of set nets;
 - Requirements to use hook removers and appropriate tools to release alive sharks;
 - Extension of the protection level already given to species listed in Annex II of the Barcelona Convention under Recommendation GFCM/36/2012/3 on the conservation of sharks and rays to the nine species included in Annex III of the same Convention.



General advice from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to management plans (II/II)

- When measures to limit or restrict fishing capacity are to be applied, they should be defined taking into account the different pressures exerted by the different fleets targeting the same stock.
- In addition, temporal, spatial and gear restrictions on the one hand, and restrictions on fleet capacity on the other, should be considered when a reduction of the overall fishing mortality is needed.
- To ensure that such measures are implemented, adequate monitoring control and surveillance (MCS) should also be enforced.



Other advice emanating from the 17th Session of the SAC

- SAC validated the technical contents of a proposal made by Oceana to stablish **three FRAs in the Strait of Sicily**, therefore the proposal is submitted to the Commission for review and possible adoption
- Use the following indicators of GES in the Mediterranean Sea:
 - Spawning stock biomass;
 - Total landings;
 - Fishing mortality;
 - Fishing effort;
 - Bycatch of vulnerable and non-target species;
 - Landings per Unit Effort (LPUE).
- Adopt DCRF and evaluate the possibility to amend existing recommendations to harmonize data requirements
- Publish first Biennial Report on the Status of Mediterranean and Black Sea fisheries during 2015.



Proposed workplan for 2015 – 2016 emanating from the 17th Session of the SAC in relation to management plans

- Perform in 2015 a full revision of input data as well as a benchmark assessment for sardine and anchovy in GSA17 and 18;
- Carry out a comprehensive evaluation of the effectiveness and consequences of harvest control rules (HCRs) included in the existing management plan for Adriatic Sea small pelagic fisheries under Recommendation GFCM/36/2013/1 as well as potential alternatives, following indications provided by the SAC;
- Carry on investigations on methods for data limited stocks (DLS), in particular for vulnerable species like elasmobranchs and red coral, as well as for the assessment of stocks targeted by small-scale fisheries;
- Implement a pilot plan of action for the assessment of European eel.
